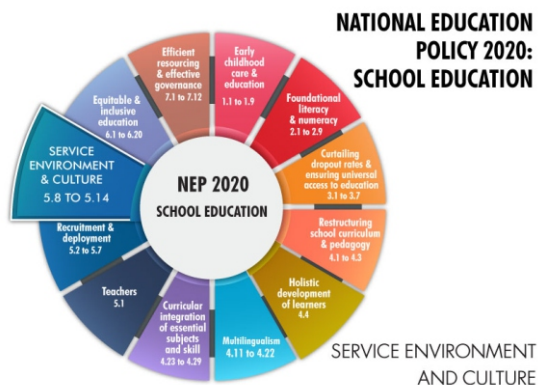

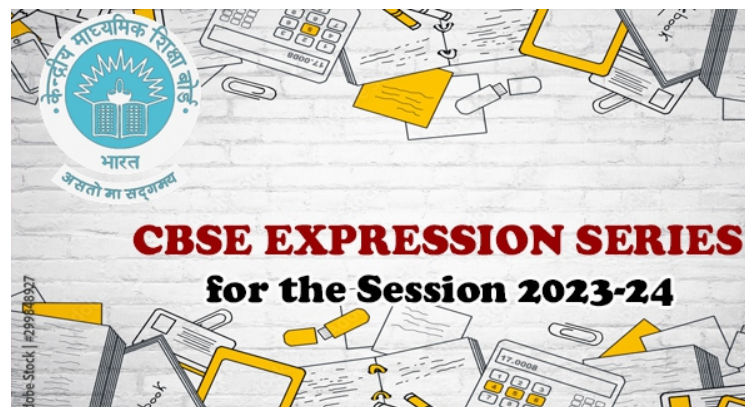


CBSE CORNER
