As per CBSE's latest guidelines under the National Curriculum Framework (NCF-2023), our school will now implement a multilingual approach to language instruction from the 2025–26 academic year. Key Highlights:

Early education will use the mother tongue or regional language as the medium of instruction. Students will gradually be introduced to additional languages (R2) in a structured and engaging manner. The focus will be on building foundational literacy and numeracy through stories, play, and activity-based learning.
